THE Managers of the Indigent Widows and Single Womens Society, in offering this their first report to the members, feel it a duty to express their gratitude to a kind Providence for the support and encouragement this institution has received; the success has been proportionate to their most sanguine expectations, and they sincerely congratulate the members on the result of their generous contributions.

The Society originated on the ninth day of January, 1817, when a constitution was adopted, and rules were formed for the government of the board of managers. In the month of March, the house formerly occupied by the Orphan Society, was rented for the use of the institution, but finding the room insufficient for the accommodation of the family, the managers at a subsequent period procured the adjoining house, and connecting the two by a door of communication, formed a large and comfortable asylum. The first persons were introduced into this building on the eighteenth of the same month, and from that period procured the same month, and from that per-

riod the admissions have gradually increased to the number of thirty-three; three of these are deceased (one of whom had lived above a century) one was discharged by her own request, to remove to another city, and one has been recently dismissed in consequence of repeated infringements of the rules of the house, leaving in the asylum at this time the number of twenty-eight. Of these a few are evidently sinking under the pressure of disease, but the greater number are as comfortable as their age will admit, and the managers have the satisfaction of stating many cases of decided improvement in health and appearance. In filling the important place of superintendant of the asylum, the managers have the pleasure of stating their entire satisfaction. After a faithful discharge of its duties for eight months, the health of Mrs. Tittermary compelled her to resign, and her place is ably filled by her successor. To danger and all suggested to bened

It has been considered a sacred duty to leave it optional with the individuals residing in the asylum to frequent the places of worship to which they had formerly been attached, but the proximity of the situation to the orphan house, where Divine worship is statedly held every Sunday afternoon, renders it convenient and agreeable to attend there. The managers return their most grateful acknowledgments for many liberal dona-

tions received, but they consider them as especially due to those gentlemen who have presented the Society with a lot of ground fifty-four feet front on Cherry Street, between Fifth and Sixth Streets, from Schuylkill, by one hundred and thirty-four feet in depth, bounding on another Street, for the erection of an asylum. The treasurer's statement herewith presented, exhibits the amount of expenditures since the establishment of the institution, and when it is taken into view how much expense is incident to a new establishment, it is believed the amount will not be considered immoderate. This brief sketch of the proceedings and present state of the institution is respectfully submitted to the members of the Society, in the full assurance that they will unite with the managers in fervent gratitude to the Giver of all good, who has so graciously smiled on the efforts used to alleviate the sufferings of the aged and infirm. And if they have been instrumental in rendering the close of life serene and comfortable, even to few worthy pious characters, under the pressure of disease, penury and desertion, is there not sufficient motive to encourage them to persevere in their exertions, to promote the interests of an institution so highly calculated to bring upon every member the blessing of those who are ready to perish!

TREASURER'S STATEMENT.

In laying before the Society the first annual statement of their funds, the treasurer feels a peculiar satisfaction in observing, that notwithstanding the discouraging circumstances under which it was organized, in consequence of the number of existing charitable institutions, its success evinces a degree of public approbation truly gratifying: and may we not infer from this success, that Providence has sanctioned the endeavour to rescue from suffering, a class of fellow beings, who without the attractions of infancy are equally helpless and dependent; who surviving all those endearing ties which give a value to existence, have no resource, no hope, but in an appeal to the principle of benevolence.

For the relief of such characters there have been raised since January, 1817, five thousand six hundred and ninety dollars fifty-seven cents. Of this sum three thousand two hundred and thirty-two dollars fifty cents have been invested in six per cent. stock and bank shares. There have been expended for the institution two thousand one hundred and ninety-four dollars thirty-six cents, leaving a balance on hand at this date of two hundred and sixty-three dollars seventy-one cents.
