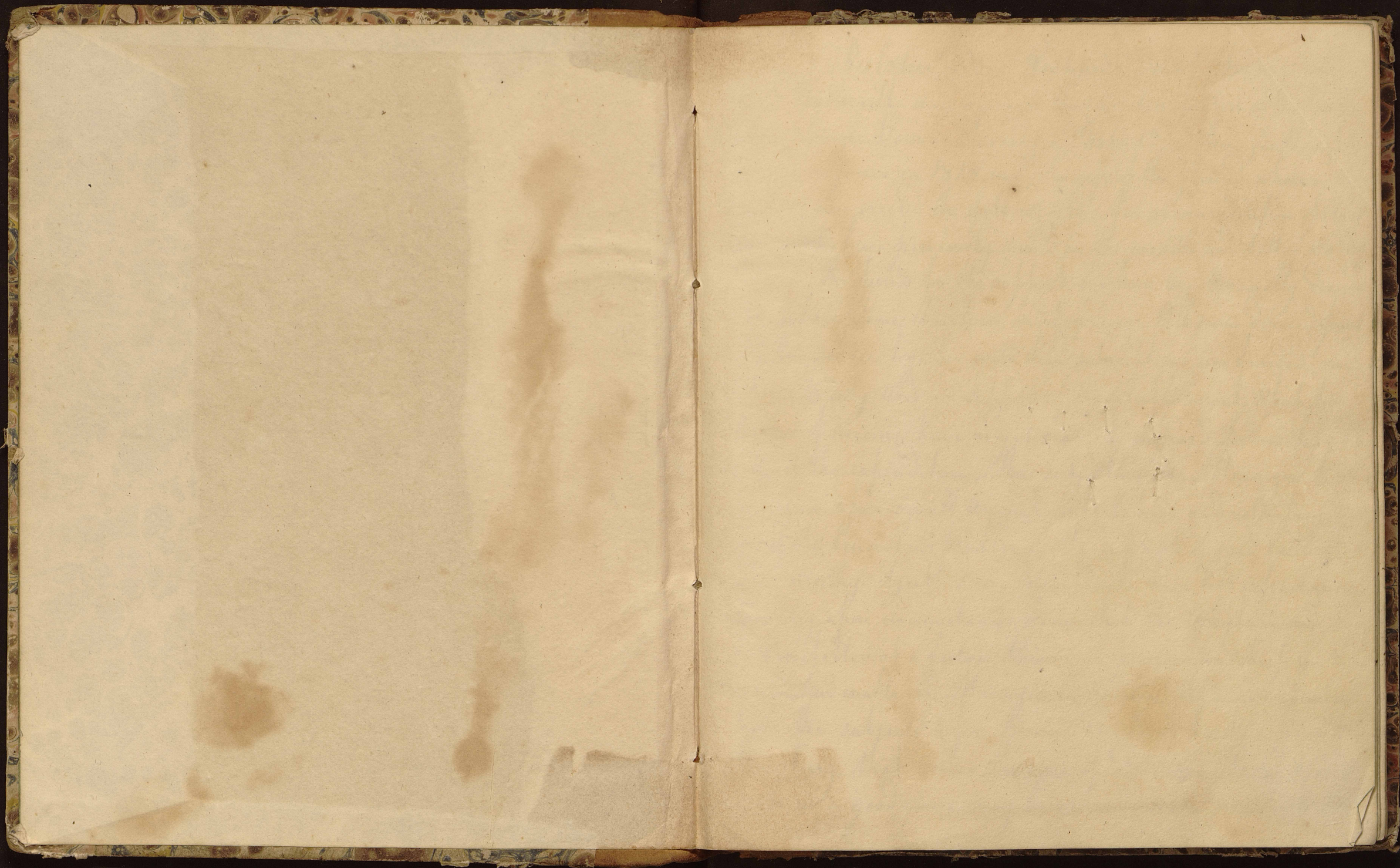


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Robert Ralston, Sam Richards, Saml Archer and
Saml Wethersill were amongst the first benefactors of the Indigent
Widows & Single Womens Society of Philad^a. These Gentlemen by
Deed of conveyance in 1818 made a gift of the Ground whereon an
Asylum was erected the following year for accommodation of Aged
Womens who have previously moved in the middle and better walks
of life - The funds for the support of whom are Annually derived
from subscriptions, donations, and Legacies - All sums derived from
the latter source, together with life subscriptions, are funded, and
the proceeds only used for support of the establishment - Which two
branches of income have as yet scarcely sufficed for meeting One
third of the expenditure - Thus subjecting the Managers to a
dependance upon small Annual Contributions, and voluntary dona-
tions of the Benevolent public - In support of said laudable &
praise Worthy object - some Individuals have left expectancies
depending upon circumstances from which the Asylum may hope
to be benefitted at a future time - To preserve and keep an account
thereof - and enable the Managers in service, the more conveniently
to have the subjects before them - This Book has been provided,
Trusting, that under the care of Divine Providence
efforts in a good cause may be crowned with success to the

Association - As likewise be accompanied with the
reward and consolation for having faithfully complied
with the Original Design and Wishes of the Donors,

Lots on Lombard near Willow Street
In the vicinity of Schuylkill River.

The above were conveyed by David C Claypoole & Wife for benefit of the Asylum by Deed April 1820. Until recently beyond the limits of improvement can now be described as fol. - Say 60 feet West of Willow Street fronting north side of Lombard 36 feet on said Str. and in depth 94 northwardly - adjoined Westward by a lot 19 by 94 the gift of the same persons to the Orphan Asylum. Next adjoining that Lot is at present the Limestone of Branson & Atkinson.

Part of the Widow's Lot has been cut down without privilege to graduation of Lombard Street - the balance remains in the original state tending to display the property unfavorably but the earth & gravel might remain until it can be either sold or removed without expense. Upon the 60 feet immediately West of Willow Street is a dwelling said to be owned by the Bank of North America. On the Northern boundary of the Widow's Lots no improvement.

Remarks
In 1833 Branson & Atkinson proposed taking the Orphan Lot on ground rent for building thereon at the rate of \$2 per front foot but which was declined and \$2⁵⁰ asked. In 1834 the same Men do not appear anxious to repeat their offer - but from remarks would be inclined to bargain for the 55 feet at \$1⁵⁰ - to such terms no reply was made but encouragement given to expect that if \$2 was offered for Widow's portion it would be considered & probably acceded to.

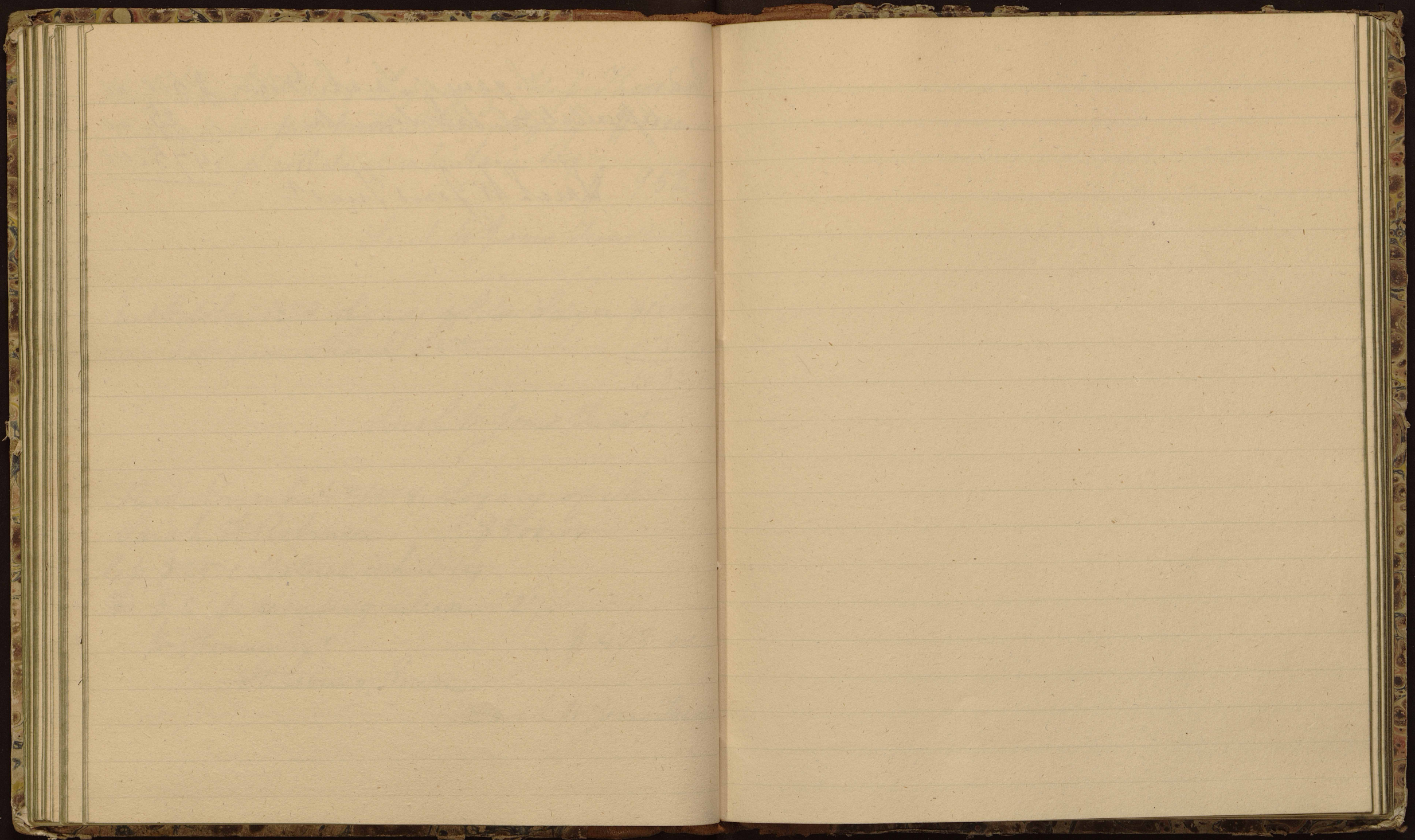
