My Own Darling Love

You do not know how much I am disappointed in receiving no letter from my darling today. The last letter that I have received was written on Tuesday but was postmarked Wednesday. Please write me every day, my darling, and write at a sufficiently early hour to let me receive the letter on the day succeeding, so that a day will not elapse between posting and delivery as heretofore.

I have read and corrected sixty pages of proof this a.m. and have done a lot of work down the street at Drexel's and elsewhere. Now comes some quiet letter writing and indexing with which to finish up the day. Cousin M. writes from Beechwood asking me to go out and dine with her but I fear that I have not time just now.

[Gippo?] and I took a little stroll last evening after our letter to you, I in my dentist's coat for sake of coolness. The air was not strictly speaking invigorating. No reply from Cockcroft to my demand for settlement. I don't know what to make of that man and his ["oleaf golder"?] proclivities.

I do trust, my darling, that you are all well and that it is not sickness which has prevented you from writing. I shall telegraph if I get no letter tomorrow morning. God bless you and Tots.
