July 8 (from Atlantic City) ... "I'm [sic] away a good deal just now and shall be more. Today I went to A. City- 11 a.m. train returned at 3:30- saw all the possibilities for our suffrage stands with Miss Brennan. The Mayor is very nice to us (a [blank space] wide open amn [sic]) and [sic] is really a suffragist [sic] apparently, not just a pretend one- so we can have a big umbrella on the beach with Votes etc. on it. & he will give us space on Steeple Chase Pier- this is the Amusement Pier see letter for description of amusements They take in 5 and 6 thousand dollars in 25 cent entrance fees so that means a big crowd of course [sic].

... I spent Monday night at Belair;; had to come in the next morning early, there was so much to do. Miss Parks(?) Gregg, McCue, all of us busy. Anna McCue is splendid. She speaks very well and is [very] [convincing]. The noon meeting today was in Kensington and Mrs. Frank Miles Day brought in her machine for it. She and Mrs. Klauder distributed literature. Anna did the speaking.

... Mrs. Lovenbury (?) and I are going to do Chatauqua for a couple of days... Miss Blanchard will see me- not an anti but not interested in suff. so I'll try and make her

Undated (from 1820 [Pine Street]) It's pouring tremendously and keeping me from my Progressive meeting.... I may go to Wash. Monday-told A.P. either Mon. or Tues. I'd be ready to beard the President with her... I'm to see Miss Shaw tomorrow or Sat. Miss Clay of Kentucky is making some technical difficulty about letting the Cong-Union join the National and we want to "belong" in time for Convention.

July 20 Mrs. Lovenbury, Mrs. Dovell, Anna McCue and I are lunching at Sedgely today. I think they will enjoy the water and we can make some C. U. plans. This is "membership week" and we're supposed to add hordes to our list, and I'm skeered fore I can't see them adding not here in Phila.

July 27 (to LL from 1820 Pine St.) ... I'm [sic] to see Mr. C. Harrison and Mr. J. B. Lippincott tomorrow - wish me luck - I want \$2000.

... Tomorrow Dr. Shaw lunches with me somewhere, I don't know where, but don't want her here. I don't quite know why - she writes [very] [affectionate] letters - she really is, but I'm not - not made that way, except for my own.

July 30 (to LL from Belair) ... M. & I & Mis [sic] P---- are leaving at 6 p.m. for a street meeting, City Hall, and shall picnic en route. ... I went to A. City for the aft. yest. with A.P. [~~as I~~] ...
