We've just come from the Senate, where we sent a great basket of purp. white + gold yellow flowers to the Sec'y of the Senate Harry Baker who has been perfect to us.

I also made up a mild quarrel with the Governor Probate Sec'y - + we're the best

of friends now. We have had a bad time with the state suffragists right along, but they're all gone now, and peace reigns.

Miss Riegel + I have been dining w. some of our friends - so many of the H.burg people have helped us. We gave made a great many new acquaintances and some friends.

The House is behaving like boys at boarding school - singing, throwing their papers about in shoals - all the bills that have been passed - the floor is about a foot thick with them. They've sent in a piano and are singing "Tipperary" and all the other familiar songs - its really great fun to watch them and especially nice not to have to worry about their vote any longer. I know so many of them now, literally dozens in House + Senate besides many employees + appointees. In all been great fun, hard work too; but one likes that when it turns out well.
