Dearest daughter,

Dr. Shaw's death is a great shock - and she is a very great personal loss. I went at once to Miss Anthony, who asked me to come.

The funeral was very beautiful, even altho' the minister who conducted it (said the prayer) is a Unitarian. She is an old friend of Dr Shaw + really cares. Caroline Baskett [Cramm?] of Kalamazoo. Dr. Shaw + I staid with her [villa?].

Miss Anthony asked me to go to the crematory place today with her + Dr Shaws 5 nieces, but I decided not to~~o~~. If she had really needed

me of course I would have gone. I can't think how she can order her life now, poor thing. She is very fine in the way she bears her sorrow - cheerful, + thinking only of doing everything just as her beloved friend would have had it done. The nieces are devoted to her, (Dr Shaw, not to Miss Anthony) as they should be, since she brought them all up after their mother died; but they have their own lives and have never been so closely associated with their Aunt as Lucy Anthony has been for nearly 30 years - a long time is it not, to have a great friendship?

Thanks much for your letter dear. I received it here just now, on my arrival. I am going to Georgia tomorrow, to tray and secure the interest of the Governor and the ratification. The legislature only sits fifty days, and about two weeks have gone already.

I am not expecting to do more than start things. Hope to get resolution introduced, with Governor's backing, and leave the finishing to others. Am thinking of our holiday you see. Buick

is harbored at Belair - am writing to M.K.K. to ask her to teleph. to Buick Service Ste. to have them send for it - clear out carbor, tighten screws etc. Then it will be in good order for our trip.

Next day. Am not leaving until Wednesday, as the Attorney General is in N.York meeting the President + does not get back until Wednesday. I would have gone today + left.
