Got in at 7.30 & shall be here all day- Syracuse trip very successful- Had fine meeting Wed. evening in spite of [thermos?] at 95 [degrees sign]. 300 people came & were so interested they staid until the very end, nearly 11- one proposed a standing vote of thanks to the pickets- & every single one stood We knew of a number who were not in sympathy in the beginning, but all were after they'd heard about it.

Got 445. in collection & pledges- and yesterday I got thirty two hundred more. 1 thousand from my listers. 1 hundred from lady who took me around in her motor

and a hundred each from 2 people I called on who had not been at the meeting.

When I landed in Syracuse Wed. morning I didn't know the name of a soul, nor where the meeting was to be, nor what hotel there was. But of course it was all easy to find out.

The people are lovely- all of them. I'm going back in the autumn. One friend wants to motor me to some interesting places- she & her husband were both so nice- also the 2 daughters.

Mrs [Hazard?] with where I staid, is also a very lovely woman- Miss Maude [Kliner?[was there too- lead 2 meetings- very nice- I'd [known?] her before. Odd that she should have spent last Sunday with Lulu- & then Lulu came to Belair- & then I found Miss M. in Syracuse.
