Sat. Oct 14 1882

3. That regular attendance at the classes through test writer and the recommendation of the candidate's teacher constitute eligibility.
4. That nominations be made one month and acted upon the next except in case of the first meeting when members may be elected from lists submitted by the teachers.
5. That the president, secy. and treas. and Business com. of the Guild be the same as those of the classes and that a Librarian be appointed.
6. That the question of fees be postponed.
7. That the evening of Saturday be reserved for social purposes.

On motion it was decided to discuss this plan in detail considering the propositions in detail order.

On motion it was decided to strike out the word teachers from Art. I. and insert instead "persons interested"

On motion Art. 2 was adopted without amendment.
 On motion Art. 3 was stricken out and the Secy appointed a Special com. to learn how eligibility is decided in other guilds.

On motion Art. 4 was laid on the table until after action shall have been reached on Art. 5.

On motion Art. 5 was stricken out and the following motion adopted viz; the officers shall be a President, Secy, Treas., and Librarian; that there shall be also an executive committee of seven to which the officers shall be added ex officio. A majority of the management thus constituted must be elected from the teachers.
 On motion Art. 6 was adopted.

On motion the Sunday question was deferred.

The teachers meeting then adjourned to reconvene as a guild meeting which was immediately done. The President Pro Tem.

then appointed a nominating committee consisting of Mr. Gawthrop Misses Bliss Clements and Kelley, who reported the following nominations. Pres. Mrs. Turner for Secy. Miss Lewis for Treas. Mr. Gawthrop for Librarian Miss Kelley. Miss Lewis declining to serve, on motion Miss Woodruff was nominated to fill the vacant position. On motion it was decided to vote on the entire ticket (including the executive com. consisting of Mrs. Coffins, Miss Mc Dowell, Miss Clements, Miss Lewis, Miss Flanagan, Bell, Miss Smith Miss Chase) which was unanimously elected.

On motion it was decided to adjourn to Thursday Oct. 19th at 7.30 P.M. to which adjourned meeting should be deferred the questions of eligibility, fees, and Sunday use of the room

The adjourned meeting of Sept. 14th met at 1109 Grand St. on Thursday Oct. 19th at 7.30 the President in the chair; present Mrs. Turner. Mrs. Coffins Misses Woodruff, Bell Carroll Mc Dowell and Kelley. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved. The executive committee presented no report. The Secy stated that she had failed to learn the methods of admission to other guilds. Mrs. Gawthrop as special committee on the subject stated that she had investigated the obsolete guild in Wilmington and found that it had perished for want of care in selecting members. The committee on securing a name presented no report. As deferred business the question of eligibility was discussed and the following motion adopted, viz: That a com. of three of the exec. com. be chosen by lot at the beginning of each month to investigate throughout

the following month the eligibility of candidates for admission to the guild; the names of the committee of any given month be thrown out until their successors shall have been chosen. This committee to report to the Board for final decision as to the election of candidates. On motion art. 2. of the plan of organization was reconsidered. On motion art. 2 was amended to read "Membership shall be decided by election of the Board, two black balls constituting cause for further investigation. On motion it was decided that "A candidate may be suggested to the Board by a member. Such suggestion must be made in writing and endorsed by the maker; but nominations must be made to the Board by members of the Board. On motion, it was voted to reconsider art. 5. of the Plan of organization ^{as amended by motion} On motion it was voted that art. 5 as amended to read "The officers shall be a President Secy. Treas. and Librarian

and there shall be an executive Board of not less than seven members to which the officers shall be added ex officio.

On motion it was voted that the fee for membership to the guild shall be .50 for initiation and \$1.00 annually.

On motion it was voted that the present Librarian shall be empowered to make all selections of books, to appoint an assistant and make all such arrangements concerning books and their distribution as she may deem best.

On motion it was voted to keep the guild room open on Sunday from 1-9 P.M.

On motion the regular monthly meeting of the guild was fixed for Friday preceding the monthly club meeting of the New Century Club.

On motion adjourned

The deferred regular meeting of the Guild met at 1112 Girard St. on Tuesday, Oct-31st at 2-45 P.M.; the Pres't in the chair Upon roll being called, sixteen answered to their names. Minutes of the Special Meeting of Oct. 14th read and approved - Treasurer, Mrs. Sawthrop reported that as no fees had been paid in, nothing had as yet come into his hands - Miss Lewis, as Ch. of Com. on names reported - that the New Century Club would not only very willingly consent to our adopting the name of the "New Century Working Women's Guild", but also kindly suggested that the Guild might some day be an honor to the Club itself.

According to a motion adopted at our last meeting, a Com. of three from the Exc. Com. were chosen by lot - to serve as Com. on Eligibility during the ensuing month, the following were chosen - Mrs. Sawthrop, Miss Mc. Jousell & Miss Woodmott.

A discussion followed in regard to the price of admission to the Guild as fixed at our

last meeting & it was understood that for the present (if preferred) only the initiation fee of .50 cents should be paid at first; and the annual fee of \$1.00 be paid in quarterly instalments throughout the year - Moved & Carried that the teachers of the Evening Classes be allowed to recommend names at a called meeting of the Exc. Com. to be held at 1109 Girard St. on Tuesday Nov. 14th at 3 P.M.

Moved & carried that the Guild offer the use of their room to the Evening Classes for their first sociable -

Moved & carried - "That we suspend Art-IV for this meeting, and any names proposed if guaranteed by the proposer be allowed to be elected at the present meeting" -

Moved & carried that the names laid on the table be elected & the Sec'y instructed to notify them that they can perfect their membership by paying their initiation fee to Miss Fore who will be at 1109 Girard St. from 9 A. M. to 10 P. M.

Moved & carried that the Bus. Com. be authorized to prepare printed circulars for the use of the Sec'y in sending out notices of election to membership - Mrs. Coggins & Miss. McSowell appointed to audit the account of the Treasurer -

Com. on Eligibility for the following month -
consist of Missis Lewis - Bliss - & Clements -

Mrs. Turner read a short paper giving the results of some inquiries as to the consideration given in different stores to the comfort of employees. Cooper & Leonard & Strawbridge & Collier being named as especially considerate.

Mrs. Coggins on behalf of the Committee appointed to secure a house for the Guild reported their efforts as quite unsuccessful. The house 1113 Girard St. was vacant but the refusal had been given a previous applicant. The Com. received a promise that in case he decided not to take the house the Guild should have it. The first applicant did not take it but the agent sent no word to our Com. & subsequently rented the house for the use of the Engineers Club.
