Minute Book

May 22<sup>nd</sup> 1895

A call for a meeting of all Guild members who had had a continuous membership of five years or more brought together about fifty on Thursday evening, May, 22<sup>nd</sup> 1895.

Miss Sawthrop occupied the chair and Miss Esther L. Jones was appointed Secretary.

The initial thought as explained by the chairman was to form an organization whereby friendships of many years might be strengthened, and the wisdom gained by long association should be utilized for the future good of the Guild. This was followed by a long and interesting discussion, in which was outlined the various lines of usefulness open to such a union.

A vote was finally taken to consider some rules already prepared, and after each one had been carefully read and discussed, with some amendments, the following was adopted.

### Preamble

An association of the members of the New Century Guild of Working Women who have been identified with its interests for a long period, is hereby formed to - First, perpetuate old friendships by annual reunions, and second, to promote the future welfare of the Guild by conferring together

### Rule I - Name

The association shall be called the Seniors of the New Century Guild.

### Rule II - Membership.

Any one who has been a member of the Guild for a period of five years, consecutively, and continues in good standing in the Guild, is entitled to membership.

### Rule III - Officers

The officers shall be a President, one or more Vice Presidents, a Secretary, and a Registrar.

### Rule IV - Meetings

There shall be two stated meetings during the year, as follows:

1. One shall be held in January, on the first Saturday of the month, (provided it does not occur on a legal holiday, in which case, the officers shall have power to name another day), and may take the form of an annual reunion, and welcome to those who have become eligible to membership by having completed the required number of years.

2. The other meeting shall be a conference, held on the first Saturday in October, to consider questions that will promote the activities and best interests of the Guild, and for the election of officers. In its relation to the Guild, the Association shall not be executive.

3. Special meetings may be called by the President, or at the request of ten members to confer on any special subject, due notice having been given.

4. The notices for all meetings shall be through the W.W. Journal.

Rule V - appointments

The officers may arrange programs and make appointments for the meetings

Rule VI - Registrar.

It shall be the duty of the Registrar to keep the membership roll, and to make a report at the January meeting of those who are eligible for membership, those who are delinquent, and, therefore, no longer members, and the number in good standing

Rule VII - Amendments.

These rules may be amended at the October meeting, provided due notice has been given through the W.W. Journal.

End.

A committee composed of Miss Emma Whataker, Mrs Sarah Shook, Miss Annie C. Reiff and Miss Margaret Keating were appointed by the chair as a nominating committee.

This committee withdrew and later reported that

Miss Esther L. Jones had been nominated by it for President, Miss Mary Thorpe and Mrs Kate L. Gallagher, First and Second Vice Presidents, Miss Katharine A. Ringwalt, Secretary and Miss Mary J. Gauthrop, Registrar. The term of office being one year. The report of the committee, was, on motion, accepted. A further motion to elect those nominated was carried unanimously.

The Chairman stated that from 1890 to 1894, inclusive, one hundred and ninety members had paid (Quies dues) consecutively, and those who had continued membership for 1895, are now members of the new section. - There are something less than fifty who if membership is continued this year will be welcomed as Seniors next January. The meeting then adjourned.

October 5, 1895.

The Senior Section held its first conference meeting Oct 5<sup>th</sup> 1895. Mrs Gallagher presiding in the absence of Miss Esther L. Jones, (Pres<sup>t</sup>)

About thirty five members were present. The roll was called by the Registrar that all present should know the names of their associates

The subjects chosen for consideration, this evening were "Why did you join the Guild and in what way have you been benefited?" "What is the greatest need of the Guild?" and "Our Gymnasium". Papers read on each of these topics stating the questions from different points of view made the basis for general discussion

Miss Eckert sent a reply to the subject, "Why did you join the Guild and how have you been benefited?" Speaking of the opportunities, advantages, pleasures and friendships found in the Guild.

In the discussion, following this paper, several members reported having joined the Guild, after first belonging to its evening classes and others that they were attracted by the advertisements in the daily newspapers and street cars a few years ago. Some had joined for the sake of association with other self supporting women, others, for the Gymnasium. One member said she had joined because she was

asked, but that she had continued a member for many reasons.

Miss Emma Krauskeller read a paper stating that the greatest need of the Guild was "Push"; - urging that greater energy and more constant thoughtfulness on the part of members for the Guild would bring about the best results. Others, voiced our greatest need as money, as a larger membership and a more general freedom in the discussions at our meetings

Papers by Miss Kalbfleisch, Miss Raynor and Dr. Davis were read on the "Gymnasium". All desiring its continuance, or rather, refitting as it has not been used prior to this time in our new home and urging the special need of opportunities for healthful physical exercise for our Guild members. It was announced that funds had been donated for that purpose and we would probably soon see the apparatus in place with regular classes for physical culture

The Senior Section of the Guild held its second annual conference meeting, Oct 3<sup>rd</sup> 1896.

Miss Ida E. Turner presided in the absence of the Pres<sup>t</sup> - Miss Esther L. Jones.

Thirty-two members were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A nominating committee of five members was appointed consisting of Miss Canning, Mrs Parzenbaker, Miss Cameron, Mrs Phillipi and Miss Carlisle. They withdrew early in the evening and later announced their nominations, as follows: For President, Miss Jennie Crawford, 1<sup>st</sup> V. Pres<sup>t</sup> - Miss Emma Marshallbar, 2<sup>nd</sup> V. Pres<sup>t</sup>, Miss Kathleen O'Flaherty, Secretary, Miss Katharine H. Ringwack and Registrar, Miss May J. Gauthroff.

The first subject discussed "How may the Seniors aid the Guild?" A thoughtful and suggestive paper was read by Mrs Rose Stevens. In this paper plans were proposed for useful work urging the Seniors as a body to arrange for special meetings to entertain junior members. The discussion following the reading of this paper resulted in the appointment of a committee to arrange for such social evenings. This committee was to consist of the officers of the section and Mrs Phillipi and Mrs Tomlinson. It was in-

structed also to arrange for the Jan. social meeting of the Senior Section.

Miss Kathleen O'Flaherty also replied to the question "How may the Seniors aid the Guild?"

The subject "The delinquent list what shall we do with it" - was next discussed. Three thoughtful papers were read by Miss M. Cresswell, Miss A.W. Rankman and Miss Canning, and Miss Ida Turner spoke urgent words as to how we should prevent the falling off of our membership. It was suggested that it would be well to send a bill to each member at the beginning of each year as is the habit in many societies.

As new business the meeting considered the proposed amendments to the rules of the Guild. That the name of the society should be changed to "The New Century Guild" omitting the words "of working women" was favored on serious thought as being to the advantage of the Guild. - That the Guild dues be raised from \$1.20 to \$1.60 a year was deemed inadvisable.

It was then announced that as every Saturday is to be taken by the Guild for meetings, it was necessary for the Senior Section to select another day of the week for its meetings.

A motion was carried to have Mondays instead

This year's celebration, on Saturday evening, January 27th, struck a new note in the selection of a man, Dr. Francis H. Green, of Pennington Seminary, as guest of honor. He brought a sparkling and inspiring message on "New Life." Miss Ida E. Turner, President of the Guild, drew from a review of the past heartening for the bigger tasks of the future.

Miss Maud R. Martin, President of the Section, presided with dignity and grace. Thousands of apple-blossoms, the work of the committee, transformed the banqueting rooms into spring-like bowers, and the unique apple-blossom favors, soon discovered to be "crickets" in disguise, added their cheerful chirpings to the frequent applause.

At the business meeting following the banquet the names of twenty new Seniors and fourteen new Grand Seniors were read. Those present were welcomed by the President, and each received a potted ivy plant. The Senior Section now numbers 402, exactly one-half the membership of the Guild at the close of 1922.

THE CANNING MEMORIAL

As a result of a sentiment expressed by the Senior body of the Guild to consider the establishment of living accommodation for members as a means of honoring the memory of Lisbeth Canning, the project was fully discussed at the last monthly meeting of the officers and chairmen of the Guild and executive board committee. The discussion, however, was confined to members of the Senior section.

According to the detailed report rendered by Miss Viola Richmon, the establishment of any suitable dwelling seemed beyond the means of the Guild, and a dangerous proposition for a business women's club to underwrite.

There are many pertinent passages in Miss Richmon's report: "We may as well say now that the \$2,500.00 now in hand is the only amount which we actually have in sight. It has been intimated that as soon as definite decision for the Lisbeth Canning Memorial is reached, more money may be contributed. That doubtless is true, but that it may be very largely increased we have no means of knowing.

"In Philadelphia we know that the Y. M. C. A. is giving living accommodations but it has a philanthropic basis; it came into being primarily through private, public, individual and collective gifts."

It is impossible for the Guild to secure the adjoining property as a means of enlarging its present sphere. The owners are not anxious to sell, and their price is beyond the Guild's purchasing power.

Various houses were discussed as possibilities, varying from a project approximating \$100,000 for a house in the city, to \$15,000 for one in the country. The general tenor of the meeting seemed to veer sharply from the living quarters idea. Various other suggestions were offered, from the endowment of another bed in the hospital to the establishment of a country club.

SYCAMORE HOUSE

Mrs. Edwin C. Grice, a near friend of Miss Canning's, addressed the members of the Senior Section on the subject of a memorial which should meet the crying need of Guild members, and thus adequately perpetuate the memory of one who served its interests with all her heart and soul.

Mrs. Grice opposed the apartment house idea. "Miss Canning would never want a memorial of that sort," the speaker continued. "Whatever you do must be done from the heart, and must come from some great need of the Guild itself. A house, you know, is never a home."

Mrs. Grice has, herself, established a little home in the true sense of the word, where lonely business women may find a haven of companionship, at a price well within the average earning capacity to meet.

"A real crime is being done to-day in real estate all over the city," says Mrs. Grice. "They are asking sixty, eighty and more dollars for rooms. My house is full to overflowing. In the last three weeks I have turned thirty young women away, and that hurts. I should like to take them all in, as we who live in Sycamore House know what it has meant to us."

Sycamore House has spaces for seven occupants. Each woman has her own room, with hot and cold water in the room, and bathroom privileges. Laundry, the use of a vacuum cleaner and such incidentals are supplied at a nominal charge. No meals are provided. In her condemnation of profits in real estate, Mrs. Grice stated that at the end of her second year at Sycamore House she had cleared five and one-eighth per cent.
