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Dear Sir,

I yesterday received a letter from J. Walker in which he says you expected to hear from me when he last saw you, but that you had not. I trust before now you have my answer to your last favour - the reason of its not being in Philad^a on Sunday is that I could not get it to Warwick time enough for the mail on Saturday, which was my intention.

J. W. also informed me you wished to see a correct list of the Negroes & to whom sold, which the many changes of Masters, has no doubt rendered necessary. I have prepared a list to this, which I thought better than to swell the Postage by an inclosure. I hope it will be found correct and satisfactory - I wished and endeavored to be able to have stated to you something more satisfactory about other affairs, particularly the Corn - I am now about selling the residue at Forsyth's Meadows supposed to be 20 Bantles for which I ask 2 1/2 Dollars, but should not be able to get that, determined to take 2 Doll^s. J. Fony hauled it all home except what Maslin & Curmon took ~~and~~ only what is above mentioned. There is now enough of that sort at the place & I think it would be better to sell the remainder J. Fony has fed his Stock altogether with it, by which your good Corn will be saved and I trust will sell much better in the Spring or Summer - I now make no efforts to sell the Corn at Rich Neck or Great plantation, that is well secured, as it must soon come to a better market. I have not yet got Col. Veny's Note for the hundred Bantles as it all has not yet been measured to him, nor have I got Rob^t. Pennington's for the 50 Bantles but it soon shall be done - The Rodder I bought myself has not yet been returned, of course I do not know the amt^l. but Pennington is to haul it & weigh it for me, & I have no doubt of his doing the latter correctly - There was about three Bantles of old Corn left at Forsyth's Meadows which I determined to charge myself for, but believe it was not done, however when I get it home will give you an acct^l of it. Tho^s Reynolds has not yet paid for the flopped, nor can I see it from him - he promises fairly - Tomory mentions there was a balance due from his Sernal after his Note he was deducted from his acct^l - The fellow has been promising me frequently to pay it, from day to day, and yesterday morning I demanded him for it - he also promises fairly, it is 6 1/2 Dollars. The Suits instituted against the delinquents at the tender, are not yet settled, nor can I force the Democratic Officers to do their duty - J. Fony has not got all his Corn yet hauled and so

best, as I think it will keep better in the State it is in than other ways; fortunately for the Corn, he could not gather it, & account of the hauling from the other places until it is laid in the field - I have as J. Walker suggested got the certificates of two men in this neighborhood best acquainted with business with respect to my charge - I understood from your letter it was to be done when we met or I would have sent it on before.

I must here sir beg you to accept of my sincere thanks for your friendship and assistance to J. Walker both for my present letter, I am sure you will not in him repeat your kindness for I have the most positive reliance on his integrity and capability.

Our fellow has thrown into a strange land and by a chain of unfortunate circumstances attending his family, almost from his birth, left destitute. No one will be more sincerely grateful for any friendly act than himself & I hope you will be assured that the obligation will be felt as long as he lives by Sir
